Equity was executive produced by AAUW of New Jersey member Candy Straight, a former investment banker, and is based on interviews from hundreds of women who have worked in finance. Equity's message aligns closely with AAUW's latest research report on the barriers and bias that women leaders face. Word is that Equity will be at The Blue Loon in the near future. Speaking of Equal Pay

September 15 marked Native American and Alaska Native women's equal pay day, the day that the wages of American Indian and Alaska Native women "caught up" to the money that white men took home last year. (It took an extra nine months, if you're counting.) Google & hash tag #NativeWomenEqualPay to honor all Native Americans, including Native Hawaiians and other Pacific Islanders, who reached "equal pay" back in August, right before black women did. Nov 1 is Latina women's Equal Pay Day.

Voting Season

We are in the midst of Voting Season! AAUW is a nonpartisan organization but we encourage everyone to exercise their right to vote. As an organization, AAUW informs its members about issues that affect women and girls such as equal pay, college sexual assault, STEM training, and Title IX. To make monitoring these issues fun, AAUW has launched a nationwide bingo game.
