Have You Heard?

In August, Margaret Soden, was one of the featured speakers at the "White Coat Ceremony" for the inaugural class of UAA/ISU's Pharmacy collaboration. The class of 2020 will begin their four year course work to obtain their PharmD degrees at the newly established partnership between University of Alaska Anchorage and Idaho State University. The latest technology means that students can receive instruction in three locations simultaneously. Meredian ID, Boise ID and Anchorage AK. For many, many years pharmacists in Alaska have been advocating for a pharmacy school in Alaska, but the reality was that there just weren't enough students to make a full-fledged school possible. There will be up to 15 students in each of the four classes on the Anchorage campus and many pharmacy locations throughout the state will provide experiential opportunities for our students. The 15 positions on the Anchorage campus are reserved for Alaska residents and there is a very demanding process for selection. Many of these students have Bachelor degrees in other disciplines or have completed a Pre-Pharmacy program which usually takes 2-4 years. Margaret's speech was about her 50+ year journey as a pharmacist and the opportunities for pharmacists in Alaska. She is always recruiting students. UAF

has several pre-pharmacy students identified. If you know of a high school or college student who is interested in pharmacy, please have them contact Margaret.

Sex-Ed Restrictions in HB 156 and FNSBSD

HB 156 brought "widespread changes to education in Alaska" according to the Alaska Dispatch on July 28 when Governor Walker allowed the House Bill to become law without his signature. Of special interest to AAUW is the amendment that requires sex education instructors and resources used in the schools to be approved by local school boards. At the October 18 Fairbanks School Board meeting Planned Parenthood and two other resources were removed as a resource in our schools pending further review as a result of HB 156. Planned Parenthood is a partner of AAUW. At the November 1st School Board meeting further discussion on this issue ensued. Questions were
