Election 2016 touched on many issues that affect women and families at every level: local, state, and federal. We still face congressional gridlock over

the Paycheck Fairness Act, resulting in more to work toward equal pay. Students are still waiting for real action on college affordability and high student debt, and they expect a continued commitment to combating campus sexual assault. Working families are still looking for good jobs with paid family and medical leave and other workplace equity policies. And Americans still don't have the basic necessity of a full Supreme Court. Alaskans voted nearly two to one to embrace a progressive new voter registration reform.

Under the new law, Alaskans who sign up to receive their annual PFD payouts from the state's oil wealth trust will be automatically added to the state's voter rolls. These results make Alaska the sixth state to have approved some form of automatic voter registration.



Shirley Liss will coordinate our local activities around National Equal Pay Day in April. Equal Pay Day is the symbolic day when women's earnings "catch up" to men's earnings from the previous year. It's also a powerful occasion to raise awareness about and organize action around the gender pay gap in our own community. The pay gap is even worse for women of color. AAUW observes Asian American Women's Equal Pay Day in March, African American Women's Equal Pay Day in August, Native American Women's Equal Pay Day in September, and Latina Equal Pay Day in October.

Kudos to Pat Babcock, Program VP, for an excellent program on Historical Women of the Tanana Valley on November 14! Four women spoke that evening about the toughness and perseverance of Pioneer women. Dealing with the frontier town mentality of misogyny and racism, the early pioneer women bonded together to create a more livable community.

Some interesting sidelights were that Fairbanks gold money helped to build Paramount Movie Studios in Hollywood after Judge Wickersham ruled against Belle Dormer who accused her partner of rape and assault, Kitty Hensley died destitute as many early women did, and Pat Babcock's family was instrumental in founding educational opportunities for early Fairbank children. The program will be repeated as an OLLI class on April 19 for those of you eligible for Osher Lifelong Learning. One of our speakers, Joan Skilbred, also has a book coming out with her research about early Fairbanks pioneer women.
